

Safety and Security is our **Job #1**

IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION



HOLD! In your room or area. Clear the halls. **ADULTS** STUDENTS

Clear the hallways and remain Close and lock door in room or area until the "All Clear" is announced Do business as usual

Account for students and adults Do business as usual



SECURE!

Get inside. Lock outside doors. STUDENTS

Return to inside of building Do business as usual

ADULTS

Bring everyone indoors Lock outside doors Increase situational awareness Account for students and adults Do business as usual



LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.

STUDENTS

Move away from sight Maintain silence Do not open the door

ADULTS

Recover students from hallway if possible Lock the classroom door Turn out the lights Move away from sight Maintain silence



EVACUATE! (A location may be specified)

STUDENTS **ADULTS**

Leave stuff behind if required to If possible, bring your phone Follow instructions

Lead students to Evacuation location Account for students and adults Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults



SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

STUDENTS

Tsunami

Use appropriate safety strategy for the hazard **ADULTS** Lead safety strategy

Do not open the door Prepare to evade or defend

Account for students and adults Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults

Safety Strategy Hazard Evacuate to shelter area Tornado Seal the room Hazmat Earthquake Drop, cover and hold


